Two Season Test

EV'IT!'s new Livengood GTX gloves offer the foul-weather commuter / tourer high functionality in a Euro-stylish package. The exterior PWR shell is constructed of "Ripstop" stretch material on the back of the hand, with treated goatskin on the palm side for added feel and abrasion resistance. A Gore-Tex membrane is bonded directly to this shell for maximum waterproofing and breathability, supplemented beneath with 3M 60g Thinsulate J subliner for added warmth. Crash protection is provided via fortified knuckles and impact absorbing Seesoft TPU panels at the outer palms. A rubbery insert is included on both index fingers for visor wiping, and the right index also has a capacitive touch panel at its tip to allow use of touchscreens without removing the gloves. Reflective piping across the wrist increases conspicuity after dark.

The interior's high loft faux fur liner is extremely plush and is itself surrounded by a layer of PrimaLoft Gold insulation to help regulate the internal temperature. The gauntlets on my size XL test pair open to approximately four inches, which is enough to clear most motorcycle jacket cuffs. Adjustment is via hook and loop on the gauntlet and a "single motion closure" strap on the wrist. Fitment runs true to size, although I found the fingers approximately 0.25" too long for my digits. Overall construction of these Chinese-made gloves is excellent, with no imperfections or defects detected.
