Though priced for the budget conscious at under **\$25.00** per pair (including microfiber bag / lens wipe), these shades offer all the functional benefits a motorcyclist could wish for. The frames are extremely light weight, the rubber coated arms and nose bridge very comfortable, and as safety glasses their polycarbonate lenses absorb 99.9% UV and meet the high impact requirements of ANSI Z87.1-2003.
